

If you haven't already begun preparing your SLI, the time to start is NOW!!!

Initial Service Line Inventory (SLI) due to GA EPD by October 16, 2024



In accordance with the Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR), all Community Water Systems (CWSs) and Non-Transient Non-Community Water Systems (NTNCWSs) must develop and submit an inventory of all service lines, including both water system-owned portions and customer-owned portions. All service lines, regardless of classification, must be included in the inventory. Even if all service lines have been identified as Non-Lead, an initial inventory must still be submitted. Water systems must submit their Initial Service Line Inventories to GA EPD by OCTOBER 16, 2024!! After initial submittal, updates to your SLI will be required until all water service lines are classified as Non-Lead.

Submitting Service Line Inventories with the 120Water PWS Portal



The Georgia EPD has contracted with 120Water to provide all Community Water Systems (CWS) and all Non-Transient Non-Community Water Systems (NTNCWS) with a software for building, managing, and submitting your SLI at no cost to the water system. Water Systems are required to submit the initial detailed Service Line Inventory to Georgia EPD via the 120Water PWS Portal. 120Water Support will be available to assist water systems in uploading SLI data from an external source, including the GA EPD SLI Spreadsheet to the PWS Portal. The GA EPD LCRR SLI Spreadsheet and Guidance Manual are posted on the EPD Website.



If you have not accessed your PWS Portal account and begun building your inventory, please register using the form on the PWS Training Registration Page. Once you are registered, you will be directed to the training video on how to use the platform and begin creating your Service Line Inventory. The Training Page also includes dates of upcoming 120Water Q&A Sessions on utilizing the Portal, regulations and funding.
